Home/School Communication: At Katikati Primary School we are committed to working with parents to ensure our students are successful at school. Good communication is key to strong home/school partnerships, so parents are encouraged to keep in regular contact with the child's class teacher. We have an open door policy so you are welcome to make an appointment at any time during the school term. To make an appointment you can: talk to the teacher directly, phone the office or email the teacher. All staff email addresses can be found on the staff page on our website. When booking an appointment, please let the teacher know what you would like to discuss so that they can adequately prepare for the meeting.

From time to time, concerns may arise or your child may share something with you that needs following up. We encourage you to contact your child's teacher in the first instance as most concerns can be resolved informally and quickly and this strengthens the home/school partnership. As incidents arise at school they are dealt with promptly and parents are contacted if deemed necessary. We will always follow up incidents thoroughly when we know about something. If your child does share something with you, please check with them first whether they have talked to a member of staff. If they haven't, we probably don't know what has happened to your child. At this point we would encourage you to contact your child's class teacher to inform them of what your child has shared so that we can investigate the incident. We appreciate you working with us to ensure that your child is safe and happy at school.



#### Parking in the Drop off Zone Beside Rooms 1 & 2

At 2.00 each day we have some children who are collected by the SESTA van by the gate in the drop off zone beside Rooms 1 & 2. It is very important that the staff who are taking these children out to the van can see if the van has arrived as well as the children getting straight into the van without having to negotiate traffic. We ask that you keep the area by the gate clear at this time of day so that we can ensure the children are safe.

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
